The academy hosted the Vaccinations UK nursing team for two flu immunisation sessions during the autumn term. Public Health England (PHE) has asked the nursing team to contact parents again and get responses from those who did not previously respond. If you have not yet responded, please complete and submit this form as soon as possible. Nurses will again be offering two types of flu vaccination: a nasal spray and an injection (gelatine free and Halal). Even if you do not want your child to have the immunisation, please complete and submit the refusal section of the form.

Draft Department for Education (DfE) guidance on Gender questioning children

On 19 December the <u>draft DfE guidance on gender questioning children</u> was published. This is a consultation exercise and has not yet been agreed for use in schools and colleges. It takes a 'parent first' approach on how schools and colleges can best support pupils questioning their gender, including requests for children and pupils to socially transition. The draft guidance covers a range of issues such as changing pronouns, single sex spaces, suitable changing accommodation, school uniform and clothing, and physical education and sport.

The Department for Education are encouraging students, parents, teachers, school leaders and governors/trustees to respond to the consultation which closes on 12 March.

The links below are to the proposal and the survey which will allow you, as a parent, to respond with your own views. The DfE also welcome students' views so you may wish to involve your child when completing the survey. Please note that you or your child should respond as an 'individual' or 'student' and not on behalf of the school 'organisation'. We understand that there are many different views on this topic within our community. This is an opportunity to share your own thoughts via this consultation. We are also sharing the consultation information with staff and trustees.
