Fire evacuations

Unfortunately, this week we have had three unplanned fire evacuations. Two of these were caused by students using either an aerosol or vape on site in student toilets. Aerosols (including body spray and deodorant) and vapes are banned items at CGA. Students bringing these items in to school risk being suspended. Any students found to have deliberately set off a fire alarm will be suspended because of the significant impact this has on student safety and the disruption it causes to learning. Please ensure that your child is clear that these items are banned and must not be brought into school. As a result of these incidents, we are reviewing student access to toilets given the need to increase levels of staff supervision.

Holocaust Memorial Day – 27 January 2024

33 Year 9 students attended the screening of My Father's Secrets at the Rio Cinema in Dalston, organised by UK Jewish Films on Wednesday as part of Holocaust remembrance. Their Head of Year, Ms Bennet, accompanied them and was incredibly proud of their behaviour throughout and their active participation in the question and answers session that took place after the film. The students thought the story behind the film was very moving, and found the animation with real historical clips inserted into it, a very effective method of storytelling. Thank you to UK Jewish Film for organising this event.

World Hijab Day (WHD) – a message from our WHD planning group in Year 10 and 13

CGA will be celebrating World Hijab Day on Thursday 1 February. This year's theme is 'Reclaiming the Narrative'. We will be having a special book display in the LRC, sharing a themed wall display and presenting















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an assembly, answering questions that students may be asking about the hijab. As well as this on Thursday, we will be hosting Wear Your Favourite Hijab to School Day where students will be invited to wear their favourite head scarf to school. Those who do not observe the hijab will have the opportunity to try one on at break time in the Nightingale Hall. Throughout the week we will be collecting donations at the gates in the morning to raise money for Helping the Needy Muslim charity campaign, which aims to reduce maternity mortality rates in Asia and Africa.
