On Thursday 26 January Year 9 students will be taking part in a live webcast organised by the Holocaust Memorial Trust to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day 2023. This year's speaker is Ruth Posner BEM who will be recounting her experience. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions via an online chat. This event supports the history curriculum being delivered this half term by putting a human face to the histories students learn about and creating the opportunity to engage with one survivor's personal experiences during the Holocaust.

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### **Street Safety**

In these winter months, with the early onset of darkness, we remind all students of the following street safety rules. Please support us in reminding your child of these rules as well. If you have any questions or concerns about street safety, please contact Mr Fyles (Designated Safeguarding Lead), or your child's Head of Year.

- 1. Walk home with a friend where possible.
- 2. Keep to main roads and streets you know.
- 3. If you need to walk home in the dark, arrange for a parent or older sibling to meet you.
- 4. Do not speak to people you do not know in the street.
- 5. If you are worried, go into a local shop and call home.
- 6. If somebody bothers you on a bus, tell the driver immediately.

### Attendance, punctuality & reporting student absence

We continue to encourage all students to attend school on time every day. Students are reminded of the benefits of attending school every day and are made aware of the time that is lost at school due to absence or poor punctuality. The school gates open at 8.15am and all students should be on site by 8.40am. There is a free breakfast for all students between 8.15am and 8.35am. This offer now includes porridge.

If your child is absent, please report each day of absence **by no later than 9am.** You can send a text through the MyEd parent app or call our absence line (0208 985 6641 select option one). Please do not report absence to other staff as this information may not get to the attendance officer in time. When reporting absence please leave a short, clear message with the following information:

- Student's full name and tutor group and your relationship to them
- Reason for absence or lateness with some detail. Please do not report students as "unwell", we need more detail e.g. vomiting, headache, fever, cough etc.
