


1. To start your school day read student notices.

You can find student notices on satchel:one (previously SMHW) in two ways (you choose!)

- It will be set as a piece of HW. You can find this on:
 - The school calendar
 - Your to-do list
 - Your calendar
- You can find it on the school noticeboard

Log into your account and click *Notice board* on the left-hand menu. Notifications for any new announcements or events will also be displayed in the bell icon at the top-right of the page.



Announcements appear as blue dots on the Notice Board, Events (including student notices) appear as red dots. Click on the dot to read more information about the event.



2. Watch the weekly assembly once a week.


The assembly will be set as a piece of HW. You can find this on:




4. Complete the work on satchel:one (previously SMHW).

If you have time left over you can:


- · focus on your independent reading
