













## What will my child study?

### In year 7, all classes are in mixed ability groups. Students will move into sets in Maths by October.













#### Key Stage 3 Curriculum







### **KS3 Curriculum and Assessment**

- At KS3 (Years 7 to 9), students follow a **broad curriculum** that prepares them to start GCSE in Year 10.
- Parents will receive three reports during the school year. These will explain:
  - how well students are **learning**
  - how well students are behaving
  - how much **progress** a student is making
- At **Parents Evening, on Thursday 23 November** there will be an opportunity to discuss your child's learning with their teachers.
- Our parents evening will be in-person, on the academy site.



### **KS3 Assessment and wellbeing**


- Our assessment model focusses on holistic student progress and avoid high-stakes testing.
- Our priority is on teachers providing students with feedback to help them improve their work and make progress.
- To support KS3 students familiarise themselves with the routine of revising for and sitting exams at KS4 and KS5, we have end of year exams in May.



### Maths Homework: Sparx Maths

- Personalised maths homework, proven to boost student grades.
- Students using Sparx Maths Homework made 83% more progress with just 15 minutes of practice every week (in comparison to those who did no homework).
- Supports metacognitive learning
- Provides parents with a weekly email on how their child is doing.
- Excellent revision tool and can be used for independent learning.



## Math's weekly homework routines

- **1** Your child will be set one homework a week by their teacher, on Sparxs via Satchel One.
- 2 Your child's homework will be based on the learning that took place two weeks ago, alongside questions that addresses their misconception from previous homework.
- 3 Your child should spend at least 30 minutes on their homework as this shows effort and commitment and will ensure that they do quality homework.
- 4 Your child will always be expected to complete their homework in their orange homework books. The expectations are:
  - i) To watch the video + take notes;
  - ii) To write down the answers from the quiz, workings neatly; alongside the codes provided
  - iii) mark their own work using a green pen, make corrections and write down their score at the end.
- 5 Homework will be checked by your child's teacher in class once a week. Your child will be expected to bring their homework book to class for their teacher to view against the criteria 4 i), ii) and iii) above.









#### Assessment

Each unit of work has at least one formative assessment and a summative assessment. After all assessments, students are given feedback by their class teacher and an opportunity to reflect on and improve their work.

#### **Home Learning**

All home learning is set via Satchel:one and will range from creative or factual written tasks to reading; research, spelling tests and quizzes. Year 7 will have one home learning task per week.



### **Reading routines at CGA**

A reading book is part of school equipment. Every student should have one in their bag, or let their tutor know if they need one.

#### We have 20 minutes quiet reading every Thursday in collective time.

- 'Read together' bookmarks will be given to students to support their independent reading.
- Year 7 students take part in Accelerated Reader programme.
- LRC lessons will be used with Years 7, 8 and 9

#### How you can support your child's reading:

- Encourage them to join Hackney Libraries for free and loan physical, audio & e-books.
- Encourage them to make a reading book a part of their daily equipment
- Encourage your child to read 30 minutes a day and have discussions about what they are reading.







HOW YOU CAN HELP YOUR CHILD



#### Morning and after school clubs (including Greenhouse Sports)

All clubs will start on Monday 18 September. All clubs are free.

The clubs list will go out in the Headteacher's letter to parents on Friday 15th September.

Students sign up on the list by the door of the classroom where the club is held e.g. sports clubs sign-up sheets are by the PE changing rooms.

Parents write a note on page 38 of your child's planner giving permission for them to attend clubs.

Students do not have to sign up in advance if they want to try a club that starts early next week.

If a club is cancelled, parents will get a message via our MyEd app.

Students leave clubs at 4pm or 4.30pm (depending on the club) from the gate nearest the club e.g. Laura Place or Almack Rd.



#### Morning and after school clubs (including Greenhouse Sports)

Breakfast club (free toast and porridge) 8.15am in the Dining Pavilion every day.

The LRC is open from 8.15-8.35am for reading, borrowing books and doing homework.

Homework club runs in the LRC - Monday to Friday 2.50pm - 4.30pm







Students will get their lockers this week. Space for coat and PE Kit No food please! No deposit or padlock needed!






We have a new designated prayer room in C06.



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

 If an appointment is absolutely necessary students are expected in school either before or after their appointment.
 Ensuring that we are aware of any medical needs Our academy attendance target for every student is 96% - 100% attendance for the whole academic year.





### Support your child's attendance and achievement:



On average – at the end of their Year 11 exams (GCSEs) - if your child is absent for less than 9 days of the school year, they will achieve grades WELL ABOVE the national average.

On average – at the end of their Year 11 exams (GCSEs) - if your child is absent for 40 days across the school year (fewer than 7 days each half term) they will achieve grades WELL BELOW the national average.







- Students must aim to be in school by 8:30am and be inside their year group gate by 8:40am **at the very latest** to allow time to go to their locker without being late for morning line-up.
- If students are late to school, they must come via Laura Place & will complete a 30-minute detention after school on the same day.
- Student lateness is only excused under exceptional circumstances. Please 'support the school' and encourage your child to be in on-time.

If you need to contact your child urgently, please call main reception. If students need to call home, they must inform their HOY or ESA. **Confiscated phones will only be** returned to a parent/guardian.



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### Importance of parents using MyEd?

Step 1 - Go to your App Store (<u>Apple iOS App</u> or <u>Google Android App</u>) Step 2 - Search for MyEd by Iris Step 3 - Download the free app

Once installed and opened **MyEd**, search for **Clapton Girls' Academy** and follow the simple instructions to set up your account and link yourself to your child/children to allow you to view the following 3 key areas:

#### My School

Allows you to view information and keep up to date with what's going on in the academy. Uploaded to this page are things like key dates, contacts, news, link to parent pay and Satchel:One and other key academy information.

#### **My Students**

Allows you to view key information about your child's school activity including attendance, absence, timetable, achievements and behaviour.

#### Messaging

Parents can send and receive free messages to and from the academy via their mobile device.

#### **Communication**

Read weekly Headteacher letters to parents (emailed every Friday morning)

Read emails

Contact CGA as soon as you have any concern / issue.

Share feedback via surveys.

In September 2020 the academy made a full switch to the MyEd parent app "In App" only function. This means that **we** will no longer be sending paid for text messages to parents but instead all text communications will go out via the free "In App" function available on MyEd.




