










Key Stage 3 Curriculum





What is my child studying?


In year 9, almost all classes are in mixed ability groups.

KS3 Curriculum and Assessment

- At KS3 (Years 7 to 9), students follow a **broad curriculum** that prepares them to start GCSE in Year 10.



In Year 9, students will select the subjects they are going to study for GCSE in Year 10 and Year 11.



Guided Preferences - timeline

Autumn Term 2023	Year 9 are introduced to Guided Preferences in PSHCE lessons.
Spring Term 2024	Students receive updated preferences booklet and receive support and guidance.
Thursday 1st February 2024 4-7pm	Parents evening and guided preferences information.
Friday 10 February 2024	Guided preferences deadline.
March 2024	Year 9 team review preferences and discuss any issues with students and parents. Preferences finalised.

Morning and after school clubs (including Greenhouse Sports)

Planners

KS3 English: Year 9

Preparing for advanced study:

Year 9 is when we hone the KS3 skills in preparation for KS4. There is a greater focus on student independence and bringing their own knowledge and interpretations to each text.

Assessment

Each unit of work has at least two assessments. After all assessments, students are given feedback by their class teacher and an opportunity to reflect on and improve their work in their **pink** assessment book. These books also contain all the assessments they completed last year, and students are encouraged to reflect on their progress over time.

Home Learning

All home learning is set via Satchel:one and will range from creative or factual written tasks to reading; research, spelling tests and quizzes. **Year 9 students will have three HL tasks per fortnight.**

KS3 English classes are mixed ability, with two smaller groups in each year to support students with additional teacher time and attention to specific skills. These small groups are reviewed each term. All classes follow the same curriculum and complete the same assessments.



Reading routines at CGA

A reading book is part of school equipment. Every student should have one in their bag, or let their tutor know if they need one.

We have 20 minutes quiet reading every Thursday in collective time.

- 'Read together' bookmarks will be given to students to support their independent reading.
- LRC lessons will be used with Years 7, 8 and 9

How you can support your child's reading:

- Encourage them to join Hackney Libraries for free and loan physical, audio & e-books.
- Encourage them to make a reading book a part of their daily equipment
- Encourage your child to read 30 minutes a day and have discussions about what they are reading.





Challenge, Well

Maths curriculum in year 9

- Scheme of Work is closely linked to MyMaths textbooks. Online versions can be found at www.kerboodle.com
- Students learn a mix of number, geometry, statistics, probability and ratio & proportion over the year.
- Students have 2 learning checks per half term and 1 assessment each term.
- Students are put into groups in the first month of school to help them make the most progress possible.









Maths Homework: Sparx Maths

- Personalised maths homework, proven to boost student grades.
- Students using Sparx Maths Homework made 83% more progress with just 15 minutes of practice every week (in comparison to those who did no homework).
- Supports metacognitive learning
- Provides parents with a weekly email on how their child is doing.
- Excellent revision tool and can be used for independent learning.



Math's weekly homework routines

- Your child will be set one homework a week by their teacher, on Sparxs via Satchel One.
- Your child's homework will be based on the learning that took place two weeks ago, alongside questions that addresses their misconception from previous homework.
- Your child should spend at least 30 minutes on their homework as this shows effort and commitment and will ensure that they do quality homework.
- Your child will always be expected to complete their homework in their orange homework books. The expectations are:
 - i) To watch the video + take notes;
 - ii) To write down the answers from the quiz, workings neatly; alongside the codes provided
 - iii) mark their own work using a green pen, make corrections and write down their score at the end.
- Homework will be checked by your child's teacher in class once a week. Your child will be expected to bring their homework book to class for their teacher to view against the criteria 4 i), ii) and iii) above.



We want **all students** to be **at school every day** to ensure that you have all of the opportunities to achieve your very best.



You can support this by:


- ➤ Not taking holidays during term time (these cannot be authorised)
- Arranging medical/dental appointments outside of school time
- ➤ If an appointment is absolutely necessary students are expected in school either before or after their appointment.
- Ensuring that we are aware of any medical needs

Our academy attendance target for every student is 96% - 100% attendance for the whole academic year.






Support your child's attendance and achievement:



On average – at the end of their Year 11 exams (GCSEs) - if your child is absent for fewer than 9 days of the school year, they will achieve grades WELL ABOVE the national

On average – at the end of their Year 11 exams (GCSEs) - if your child is absent for 40 days across the school year (fewer than 7 days each half term) they will achieve grades WELL BELOW the national average.







- Students must aim to be in school by 8:30am and be inside their year group gate by 8:40am at the very latest to allow time to go to their locker without being late for morning line-up.
- If students are late to school, they must come via Laura Place & will complete a 30-minute detention after school on the same day.
- Student lateness is only excused under exceptional circumstances. Please 'support the school' and encourage your child to be in on-time.



Uniform policy

- Smart, flat plain black leather look, hard soled shoes or ankle boots no higher than ankle height. Students are not allowed to wear trainers.

Students in the wrong uniform may have to be out of normal lessons. This may have a negative impact on learning outcomes.



Mobile phones and ear pods seen/used/heard in lessons or around the school will be confiscated. This will result in a same day 30-minute afterschool detention.

If you need to contact your child urgently, please call main reception. If students need to call home, they must inform their HOY or ESA.

Confiscated phones will only be returned to a parent/guardian.
